



So I ran to my local Ford dealer only to find both were no longer available...


But, upon leaving, I saw a Mustant II and there on the inside door panel was the logo I needed. The part number is as follows: D4ZZ-6920802-A

After getting the part, I went to a local leather shop where i purchased a blank belt buckle. The owner assured me that these blank buckles can be had readily all over the country so no one should have any problem.


Affixing the horse was no problem. Two holes were drilled in the buckle and the horse inserted. The extra length of the pins was cut off and the rest was peened over forming a rivet head.



This month's car of the month is unusual due to the fact that we are featuring not one but a collection of Mustangs and Shelbys.

The December Cars of the Month belong to Judy and Tony Branda of Altoona, Pennsylvania. Being a dealer of Mustang and Shelby parts, you would expect them to have a nice car or two...but pictured on this page are five outstanding Shelbys and Mustangs from their collection. They have owned 35 Shelbys and 25 Mustangs since 1974. These are the ones they kept for themselves.

Car #1: 1966 Shelby (white with blue stripes) which was purchased by them in 1977 and is the 197th Shelby built. The car has many 1965 items on it—so as in Tony's words, "This car enjoys the best of both years." The car is totally restored and has 53,000 actual miles.


Car #2: 1966 Shelby Hertz (black with gold stripes) is automatic, is totally restored and has 61,000 miles and was purchased in 1976.

Car #3: 1966 Mustang GT 2+2 fast-back. This is a genuine K-car and was purchased new in 1966 by a priest who was over 50 years old. This car is dark blue, 4-speed, Rally-Pac, AM/tape player, Rally wheels, totally original with 71,000 actual miles. Tony purchased the car from the priest who told him he knew Ford had a better idea.

Car #4: 1967 Shelby GT 350 (black) totally restored and was purchased in 1978 in Texas. There is a total of 39,000 miles on the car.

# A BARE FIND



Regarding the search for the oldest Mustang; in my last letter I wrote that we had just purchased an early  $1964\frac{1}{2}$  convertible, with an indicated build date of 2/15/64 (15B) three weeks before the official start of production on March 9th. I have since checked with the Ford Archives and the Ford production statistics department in Dearborn, both ofwhich had no information which would contradict that this car was one of a group of special order cars built specifically for the Mustang introduction at the New York World's Fair in 1964. The region designation (DSO) on the door identification tag is 842011 indicating a Ford reserve special order.

I have enclosed several photographs one of which shows a steel plate, welded to the underside of the front frame cross-member, which was used to attach the car to a moving conveyor which took Fair visitors through the Ford exhibit. (See page 163 of "The Ford Road" book).

I purchased the car from the original owner, a Ford employee, who bought the car from the Ford Company car resale lot in Dearborn in December of 1965. He explained that after the car was used at the Fair, it, along with the rest of the other display cars was returned to Detroit where it was re-trimmed before being sold.

The car has other unique features which can be attributed to its unusual early life at the Fair. It has standard type trim with a bench seat. It also has door courtesy lights similar to those used with the Pony trim, but with a 1961 Thunderbird part number. It has an AM tape deck which was not available for production cars in 1965 and completely filled and finished metal joints where the rear quarter fits to the door "B" post, indicative of show car body preparation. It was also scheduled and built with a 200 CID engine which was not available until later, although it was available in other Fords in



1964. A special wiring harness was run to the trunk and interior rear quarter areas, probably for supplemental interior lighting required for display purposes. The V.I.N. is handwritten in "magic marker" on top of the gasoline tank, suggesting all the major parts were collected and assigned to a certain car prior to assembly, definitely not a production procedure. The interior handles and heater controls are of the early 1965-type.

The car has 35,000 miles, and generally is in very good condition, with the original tires, and the spare still in the trunk. There were no alterations or modifications ever made to the car except replacement of the water pump. There is some evidence of rust but only very minor in the typical Mustang locations. The underside is perfect and structurally like new.

It is our intention to completely restore the car, leaving all of the features exactly as when the car was built. We would like to have it ready for Chattanooga next spring, if at all possible. I am sure if we enter it in the judging, there is bound to be some question as to originality and authenticity. However, this is a very unique car and it will be shown exactly as it was sold by Ford.

We intend to continue our research, working with the Ford Archives to find photographs taken at the Fair, or any other information which would apply to these very early Mustangs. If any other members can help in this research project, we would appreciate hearing from them.

# '60s Mustang Owners Are Riding High

Chicago Tribune

LOS ANGELES — Within the costlier precincts of southern California, where a Mercedes or even a Rolls-Royce is as commonpiace as a Gucci shoe, the true connoisseur drives a '65 Ford.

Not just any '65 Ford, of course, but a sleek and now classic Mustang convertible, the car that is beginning to rival the regal Thunderbird itself as America's contemporary automotive masterplece.

Mustang clubs are dotted about the country. Some dealerships sell nothing but restored Mustangs, and other firms specialize in renovating them. There is even a monthly magazine called "Mustang News."

The intense interest in the Mustang, particularly the 1965 and 1966 models, has driven up the cost until many now sell for more than twice their original price. One collector in Georgia recently turned down \$12,000 for a mint-condition '66 convertible."

That proposed price was considered grossly excessive by most Mustang experts (and there are thousands of knowledgeable afficionados who deserve that title). But prices of \$6,000 are not unusual—still remarkable for a car that sold new for only about \$2,800.

Car #5: 1970 Mustang Boss 302 (grabber orange with black stripes) Tony purchased this car new in 1970 and it is totally original with only 17,000 miles. Has fourspeed, slats, spoilers and is loaded. Tony has had a number of people try to buy this car. Tony states it would be necessary that he sell his wife first.

#### Common Car

The early-Mustang phenomenon is all the more amazing because it is a common car; millions have been manufactured and are still on the road. Ford built 417,000 Mustangs in 1965 aione, setting an industry record for first-year production.

There are all sorts of Mustang freaks. Some collect only '65 or '66 convertibles (the body changed in '67). Others are interested solely in the Shelby Mustang, a modified fastback with high-performance options.

Specialties are taken so seriously that mixing models is often avoided at runs and rallies sponsored by Mustang organizations.

The proud owner of a tropical turquoise '65 topless with all the original trim would naturally tend to regard himself as superior to the driver of the '68 coupe that lacked its original upholstery.

Its original upholstery.

And the owner of a '66 Shelby GT350 equipped with the optional whinny horn and the "glowing horsey," a translucent plastic pièce that highlights the grill ornaments ... well, like the Cabots and the Lodges, he would confer mostly with God.

#### It's Serious

"They tend to take this stuff very seriously," said Bob Page, editor of Mustang News. "Every collector wants his car to be absolutely authentic, and most have their specialties." Page knows of collectors who have six or more Mustangs. One Californian has an inventory of 15, including four prize convertibles that he has put aside for his grand-children, the oldest of whom is 14.

children, the oldest of whom is 14.

"For one thing, the styling is still very up-to-date," said E. K. Beaumont, operator of a California dealership that sells only reconditioned Mustangs. "The Mustang was the first of its type; it started a brand-new trend in automotive design. A whole generation of carse has copied it, from the Camaro to the Celica."

Another apparent explanation is price. Even though immaculate, early-model convertibles bring top dollar, it is still possible to latch on to one needing a little work for around \$3,000. Prices for a coupe are even less

are even less.

"Most people who are into Mustangs never have been car collectors before." Page said. "A lot of women are doing it. They like the fact that they can get mechanical work and even body work done at almost any Ford dealership. Nearly all of the parts are still available."

This contrasts with the hapless Thunderbird owner who, after shelling out as much as \$20,000 for one of those '55 two-seaters that were the gnawing envy of his youth, must then be prepared to go through endless torture and expense to find replacement parts and capable mechanics.

#### 1979 MUSTANG CLUB OF AMERICA SHOW RULES & JUDGING GUIDELINES

- 1. A contestant must decide at the time of entry which class he wants to enter his car. Once the car has been entered, its class cannot be changed without the concurrance of MCA for that particular meet. MCA will not be responsible for deciding if a car is modified or not. The class, however, may be changed at the next meet.
- 2. Before a car (stock or modified) receives its official entry number, it must pass through the technical inspection. The car owner will be required to be with the car at this time.
- 3. Any car that does not have a Ford drive train will not be allowed to compete.
- 4. To provide for consistency in judging, a judge will judge the same phase on all cars they judge.
- 5. A team of judges will complete their phase of judging on a car before starting another car.
- 6. Modified cars will not be judged for authencity points. They will be awarded modified points only for areas that are modified. No points will be given for stock. They will be judged for Quality of Workmanship, Condition and Cleanliness.
- 7. Best of Show will be the car that receives the highest composite score.


